Dear Parent and Camper,

We are excited to have your child join us for the 2026 Associational Children's Camp at Falls Creek. Children's Camp is for students who have completed 3rd through 6th grade. This packet includes important information, camp expectations, and forms. Please read the packet in its entirety.

Children's Camp is scheduled for Wednesday, May 27 through Saturday, May 30, 2026. The camp is \$65 per person. Please speak with Pastor Joel if the cost would keep your child from attending. Before camp, the primary contact is kidsmin@chandlersouthern.org. During camp, parents may call or text Pastor Joel's cell phone at (918) 759-8274.

Because this is children's camp, our group will stay together throughout the week. No camper may go anywhere on Falls Creek grounds without a sponsor. We will attend worship, Bible study, meals, cabin devotionals, MissionFest, and recreation together as a church group. The only regular exception is swimming, which is divided by gender each day and supervised by sponsors.

Please read this packet carefully and return the forms at the end. Also, please make sure Pastor Joel has every parent or guardian phone number that should be used in case of an emergency or if your child needs to call home during camp.

What is Falls Creek?

Falls Creek is a Christian camp in the Arbuckle Mountains near Davis, Oklahoma. During Associational Children's Camp, churches stay in cabins, provide adult sponsors, participate in camp-wide worship and Bible study, and guide children through recreation and cabin devotion times.

How to pray this week

- Pray that campers would grasp how wide, long, high, and deep the love of Christ is.
- Pray for the children to listen well during Bible study, worship, and cabin devotionals.
- Pray for safety, unity, wisdom for sponsors, and for clear spiritual conversations.
- Pray that any child who responds to the gospel would receive careful follow-up and encouragement.

Camp Schedule

This schedule is based on the 2026 ACC schedule. Some details may be adjusted after check-in, and our group schedule may be adjusted by the lead sponsor as needed.

Time	Activity
11:30 a.m.	Arrive at Chandler Southern Baptist Church. Check in, load luggage, confirm paperwork, and confirm parent/emergency phone numbers.
~12:00 p.m.	Depart for Falls Creek.
Upon arrival	Unload and set up the cabin. Campers must help unload and get the cabin ready.
After arrival	Campers must stay in the cabin with sponsors until wristbands are received. No camper may leave the cabin or go anywhere on Falls Creek grounds without a sponsor.
2:00-5:00 p.m.	ACC check-in at Mathena Event Center. Pastor Joel will register our group as lead sponsor.
After registration and cabin setup	Once Pastor Joel returns, wristbands are distributed, and the cabin is fully set up, our group will go together to Centennial Plaza, where the Icee stand and gift shop are located.
2:00-5:00 p.m.	Only recreation opportunity available: swimming option, girls at Entry Pool and boys at Baptist Lake, if our group is ready and sponsors determine there is time.
5:00-6:45 p.m.	Supper and preparation for worship.
7:00-8:00 p.m.	Worship in the Tabernacle.
8:00-9:00 p.m.	Evening snack available in the cabin and group activities.
9:00 p.m.	Cabin devotionals begin.

Our Group Plan

- We stay together. At children’s camp, our group stays together for worship, Bible study, meals, cabin devotionals, MissionFest, and recreation. No camper may go anywhere without a sponsor.
- MissionFest. We will attend MissionFest on Friday from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. at the Mathena Event Center. All campers will wear the group t-shirt to MissionFest and to the worship service that evening.
- Boulder Springs. We will plan our Boulder Springs group outing for Thursday afternoon so campers do not have to change after MissionFest. Campers should bring a change of appropriate clothes for getting wet and dirty. Swimsuits are not allowed at Boulder Springs.
- Swimming exception. Swimming is divided by gender each day. Adult sponsors of the same gender will supervise campers at the assigned swimming location. No camper may go to or from swimming without a sponsor.
- **Recreation poll.** At the parent and camper meeting, Pastor Joel will poll families and campers about preferred recreation activities for the week.

Available recreation options

- Co-ed kickball
- Co-ed volleyball
- Wild and Crazy Recreation
- Swimming
- Skate Park, for campers who bring the required equipment, follow all skate park rules, and remain with a sponsor
- Boulder Springs with our church group on Thursday afternoon

- Campers must wear shoes to and from swimming areas.
- Boys must wear a shirt and girls must wear a long covering over swimsuits while going to and from swimming areas.
- Knee-length garments must be worn by campers and sponsors to and from swimming areas.
- Modest swimsuits are expected. A dark t-shirt must be worn over two-piece swimsuits.
- Campers should not take money or valuables to the swimming area.

Cell Phone Policy

Children's Camp policy for our group

No camper cell phones are allowed at children's camp.

Please do not send a cell phone with your child. If a camper brings a phone, it will be held by the lead sponsor until the end of camp or returned to a parent before departure.

- Parents may call or text Pastor Joel's cell phone during camp: (918) 759-8274.
- Campers may use Pastor Joel's cell phone to call parents when needed.
- Parents must make sure Pastor Joel has all parent or guardian phone numbers before we leave for camp.
- Campers should not bring smart watches, tablets, gaming devices, music devices, earbuds, or other electronics.

Why this matters

This policy helps sponsors keep children safe, focused, and fully present at camp. It also prevents lost or damaged devices and removes the temptation to take or share inappropriate photos.

Parent phone numbers

Please complete the Parent and Emergency Contact Information page at the end of this packet. List every parent, guardian, or emergency contact who should be reached during camp. This is essential because campers will not have cell phones at children's camp.

Falls Creek Dress Code

Falls Creek dress code applies to children's camp. The goal is modesty above legalism and a distinctly Christian atmosphere where clothing does not distract from the purpose of camp.

General dress code

- Shoes and shirts must be worn at all times outside the cabin, except while swimming.
- Campers may not wear apparel that exposes the midriff.
- Clothing may not be extremely tight fitting.
- Clothing may not have writing on the back of pants or shorts.
- Clothing may not display or promote tobacco, alcohol, controlled substances, inappropriate language, or inappropriate pictures.
- Shorts should have at least a five-inch inseam or longer.
- Dresses and skirts should be four inches from the top of the knee or longer. Slits should also be modest.
- Straps for shirts and tops must be at least three inches across the shoulder.

Swimming dress code

- Modest swimsuits are expected.
- A dark t-shirt must be worn over two-piece swimsuits.
- Boys should not wear tight-fitting swimming suits.
- Campers must wear the required covering and shoes when going to and from swimming areas.

Helpful rule of thumb

If you are not sure whether something meets the dress code, pack something else.

Spending money

Spending money is optional. Concessions, t-shirts, devotional items, journals, and other items may be available at the Falls Creek gift shop. All optional expenses are the responsibility of the camper.

If mailing, consider sending prior to camp or the first day of camp to allow for delivery during camp.

What Not to Bring

- Cell phones, smart watches, tablets, gaming devices, music devices, earbuds, or other electronics
- Prank items
- Tobacco, vapes, alcohol, drugs, or controlled substances
- Food or drinks, unless approved for medical reasons
- Clothing promoting alcohol, tobacco, drugs, inappropriate language, or inappropriate pictures
- Extremely short or tight clothing
- Clothing that exposes the midriff
- Clothing with writing on the back of shorts or pants
- Knives, weapons, fireworks, or anything that could be used as a weapon
- Shaving cream or supplies intended for pranks
- Bad attitudes

Additional camp rules

- Campers may not go anywhere on Falls Creek grounds without a sponsor.
- Campers should leave areas better than they found them.
- Campers are expected to participate in worship, Bible study, cabin devotionals, and group activities with a positive attitude.
- Campers are expected to show Christ-like character and follow the Golden Rule.
- Rock throwing, water fighting, shaving cream fighting, and use of tobacco are not allowed.
- Fireworks, scooters, bicycles, and skateboards outside the Skate Park are prohibited.
- Campers may not ride in the beds of pickups.
- Campers going to the First Aid Station must be accompanied by a sponsor.

Camp Project: Rooted Interviews and Recap Video

During camp, campers will be interviewed at strategic points throughout the week about what they are learning, how they are growing, and what they are enjoying at camp. These clips will be compiled into a recap video to show in the worship service the following Sunday. All campers are expected to participate in the camp project. Sponsors may participate as needed, but the main focus will be the campers.

The purpose is to help the church celebrate what God is doing at camp, encourage families, and give campers a simple way to share what they experienced.

Medical, First Aid, and Insurance

A release form must be completed for each camper and signed by a parent or guardian. The release form helps first aid personnel care for an injured or ill camper.

- Many minor injuries or illnesses can be handled in the church cabin.
- If medical attention is needed, a sponsor or appointed adult will go with the camper to the First Aid Station.
- If an illness or injury is serious, the camper may be sent to a hospital or doctor in a nearby town, but should first go to the First Aid Station for medical care and an insurance claim form.
- Camper insurance is included in the registration fee.
- Unregistered persons are not covered by camp insurance.

Medication

- All medications should be clearly labeled with the camper's name.
- Parents should provide clear written instructions for dosage and timing.
- Sponsors need to know about allergies, medical conditions, dietary restrictions, inhalers, EpiPens, or other medical needs before departure.

Severe weather

- Falls Creek monitors potential inclement weather and communicates with local law enforcement and emergency management officials.
- If emergency sirens sound, campers return to cabins or move to the nearest safe building as directed.
- At the sound of one continuous siren, campers move immediately to the nearest cabin or building, go to the innermost room on the bottom floor, and wait for the all-clear signal.

8. Complete the medical release and digital signature.

Release of Claims, Hold Harmless, and Authorization for Emergency Medical or Dental Care to Minor

Calendar Year 2026

This Release and Consent is entered into on this ____ day of _____, 2026, by _____ (Parent), the parent or legal guardian of _____ (hereinafter referred to as Minor).

1. Parent warrants and agrees that he/she has legal custody or is the legal guardian of the minor listed above, understands the terms of this Release and Consent, and has signed this document by his/her own free will.
2. Parent acknowledges that Minor will, with Parent's permission, participate in certain activities conducted by or sponsored by Chandler Southern Baptist Church, its directors, officers, employees, and agents, collectively referred to as CSBC, during the duration of this agreement.
3. Parent, individually and on behalf of Minor, releases and agrees to hold CSBC harmless from all liability for harm to Minor or Minor's personal property, resulting directly or indirectly from Minor's participation in CSBC activities. Parent, individually and on behalf of Minor, personally assumes all risks and liabilities in connection with Minor's participation in CSBC activities and agrees to indemnify CSBC against any liability which might be assessed against it as a direct or indirect result of Minor's participation in CSBC activities.
4. In the event of Minor's injury during any CSBC activity and Parent's unavailability to authorize medical treatment, Parent authorizes dental, medical, or surgical treatment, including but not limited to the administration of X-rays, anesthetic, or anesthesia, by any medical professional chosen by CSBC. Parent understands and agrees that this consent is given to encourage CSBC and the medical professional to exercise their best judgment as to such diagnosis or medical, dental, or surgical treatment. Parent personally assumes the duty of payment of any medical professional, hospital, clinic, or ambulance service and releases CSBC from any such duty of payment. This medical authorization is provided pursuant to Title 10, Section 170.1 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
5. Parent understands and agrees that this Release and Consent shall remain in effect for a period of one year or until Parent's written revocation, whichever is first, and that Parent's consent to treatment shall remain in effect until revoked orally or in writing to CSBC or to the licensed medical professional treating Minor.
